Junior Certificate of Education

- Minimum points earned based on students individualised learning program
- Successful completion of literacy and numeracy program

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WHAT IS THE JCE?

The Junior Certificate of Education (JCE) is Charleville State High Schools junior secondary school-based qualification. It is awarded to eligible students at the end of Year 9 when they complete their junior phase of education.

Learning points are accumulated in Year 8 and 9 only. Eligible students will be awarded their JCE at a ceremony in Week 9 of Term 4.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF

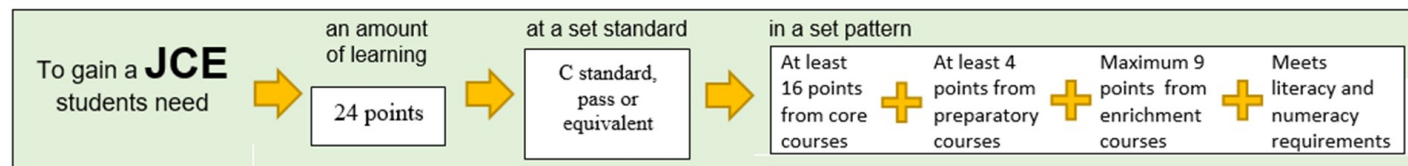
- Encourage student engagement and achievement.
- Celebrate students achievement and academic success.
- Help prepare junior students for their senior education.
- Provides potential employers with insight into their potential employees.



HOW DOES THE JCE WORK?

To be awarded a JCE, students need to demonstrate a significant amount of learning, to a set standard and in a set pattern, while meeting literacy and numeracy requirements.

Students **must have at least 24 points** in the required pattern below and have met the literacy and numeracy requirements to be awarded a JCE.



COURSE TYPES:

Core Courses:

- English, Maths, Science and Humanities, HPE.
- One point is received for each subject, per semester (in Year 8 & 9) when a C standard or above is achieved.
- A minimum of 16 points required from Core.

Preparatory Courses:

- Develop the skills required for senior subjects through elective subjects.
- Students must complete two continual semesters of one elective in both Year 8 & 9.
- One point is received for each subject, per semester (in Year 8 and 9) when a C standard or above is achieved.
- A minimum of 4 points is required from Preparatory.

Enrichment Courses:

- Courses or subjects that provide students with opportunities to develop their skills and knowledge at a higher level.
- Includes recognised certificates and awards, structured workplace or community-based learning programs, learning projects, and non-QCAA school based courses.
- One point is achieved per test by achieving Upper 2 Bands for NAPLAN.
- A maximum of 9 points from these courses can contribute to the JCE.
